By serving patients with a limited prognosis of less than 12 months, *Ambulance Wish Singapore* aims to transform the end-of-life experience by bringing moments of joy, peace and comfort to patients and their loved ones.

As a volunteer-enabled organisation, our work extends care beyond hospitals and hospices into homes and hearts across the community.

Our work is rooted in our motto, "Fulfilling Wishes, Celebrating Lives".

### Our Vision

To transform the end-of-life experience of terminally ill patients and their loved ones, beyond basic palliative care services.

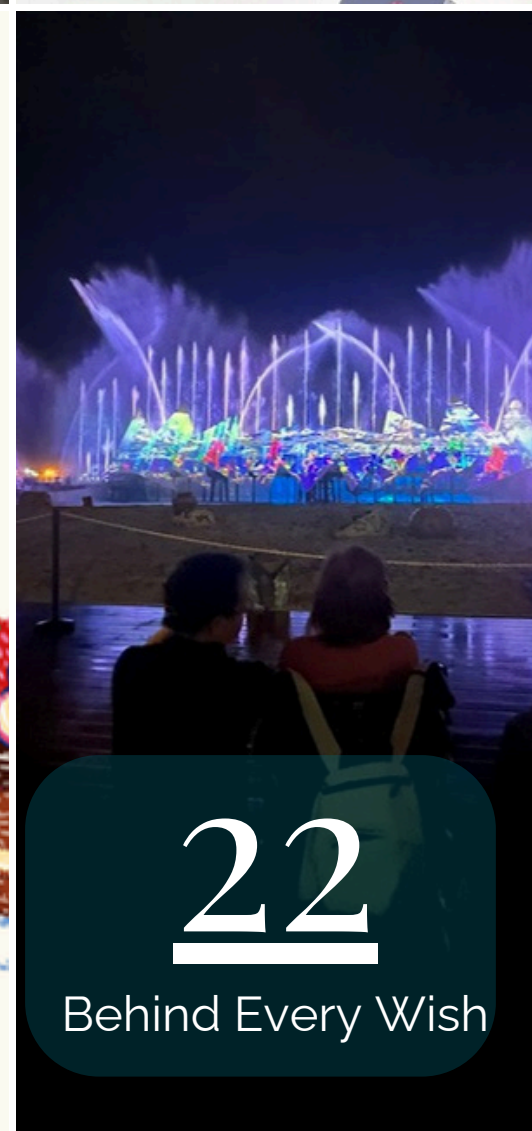

# FOREWORD

Anniversaries invite not only celebration, but also reflection. As *Ambulance Wish Singapore* marks its seventh year, it is worth returning to the founding premise that brought this organisation into being: that what we value deeply in our lives—dignity, agency, and human connection—remains essential, even—and especially—at the end of life.

In its earliest days, this initiative was shaped by a small group of individuals who recognised a gap not in systems, but in experience. We were a very small team who came together with very little resources, putting in our time, money, and network, with a strong belief and passion to build a programme which honours what matters to each of us, especially when facing life-limiting conditions.

What has emerged over seven years is a programme that is well-established in Singapore and trusted by patients, families, and healthcare partners. Today, we work with over 30 referring organisations, with a goal of fulfilling 260 wishes this year. As we grow, we are not simply an organisation, but a network of care. Volunteers, healthcare partners, donors, and families have contributed to a practice that is compassionate yet transformative. Each wish fulfilled underscores a fundamental truth: that small, intentional acts to honour what matters to each person can carry immense emotional and social impact.

As we look ahead, the work remains both necessary and urgent, to help each person fulfil their last wish at the end of life. The foundation laid over these seven years offers a clear indication of what is possible when compassion is organised, and when care is extended beyond obligation into genuine human regard.

# FULFILLING AWISH

## An Afternoon of Courage and Truth

**Ms Chu**, 53, diagnosed with intra abdominal liposarcoma, with 3-6 months of prognosis.

When the unknown arrived, fear did not disappear. Instead of trying to overcome it, she learned to live alongside it. Over time, that fear loosened its hold and led her to step into another unknown, a journey across Africa.

Africa was not an escape or a search for answers.

It became a space where moments and encounters shifted how she related to fear, presence, and choice. During this period, Ms Chu began writing to reflect on her life.

These reflections became a collection of Chinese poems titled 《我竟然把我的肚子搞大了》. The title carries a subtle sense of irony, reflecting her choice to name something difficult rather than turn away from it. The book is accompanied by photographs from her journey.





For her wish, Ms. Chu desired to publicly share the narrative behind her book.

An intimate gathering was held one March afternoon at a beautiful café near the city center. During the event, she shared stories of her life and travels, inviting

guests to browse the photographs and reflect on the work in their own time.

All proceeds from the book sales were donated to Kwong Wai Shiu Hospital, the facility currently providing care for her mother. 🌸

Reliable and consistently responsive, Kezia readily steps forward whenever support is needed—whether in delivering care or preserving the emotional significance of each experience.

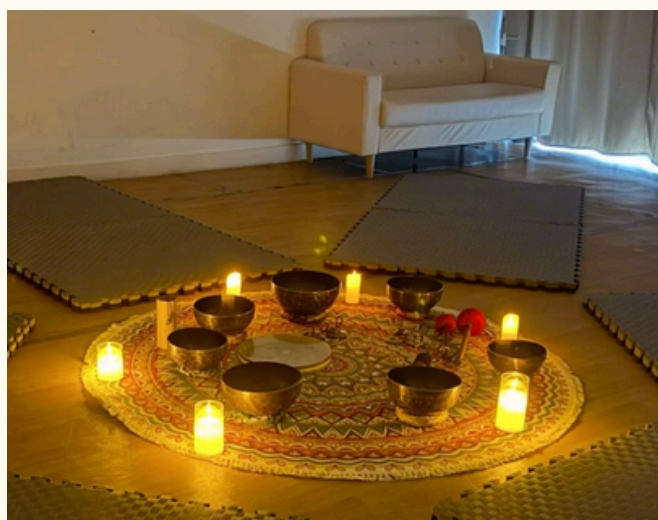

# REFER A WISH

These are the steps involved in wish requests.



1. Form must be completed and signed by the patient, next-of-kin, or official referrer (physician/medical social worker).



2. Wish Eligibility — *Ambulance Wish Singapore* will do the necessary checks to confirm whether the patient is medically eligible to receive the wish.

Anyone aged **19 and above** who has **<12 months prognosis**. This includes those with:

- **End-stage conditions**, eg organ failure and late-stage cancer
- General frailty and co-existing conditions with death expected **within 12 months**
- Conditions that put them at risk of dying from a sudden acute crisis
- **Life-threatening acute conditions** caused by sudden catastrophic events
- Is Singaporean or Permanent Resident
- Has not previously had a wish fulfilled by *Ambulance Wish Singapore*

Patients who may be eligible to receive a wish can be referred by:

- Medical professionals (eg doctor, nurse, allied health professional, medical social worker)
- Family members with detailed knowledge of patient's current condition

A patient may also apply for a wish directly by filling in the form found in the above button.

3. Determining the Wish

*Ambulance Wish Singapore* assigns a team of volunteer wish granters to explore the wish request.

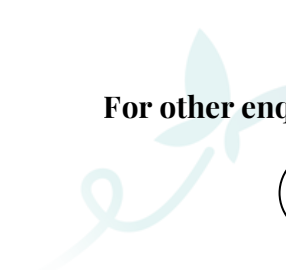
With the assistance of medical social worker/wish referrer, wish granters will have a chat with the patient/next-of-kin to determine the details.

4. Granting the Wish

Once the wish has been confirmed, *Ambulance Wish Singapore* sets out to create a memorable and meaningful wish experience for the patient.

We strive to give timely attention to all wish requests and will liaise closely with the patient's healthcare team to ensure that their health condition allows the wish plan to be carried out. 🌿

# What Can You Wish For?

Wish requests typically fall into these four major categories. The possibilities, however, are endless because each patient is unique.



## I wish to go...

to a place of personal significance (eg home, beach), or attend a loved one's milestone event (eg birthday, wedding)



## I wish to meet...

those who mean a lot to me, like my spouse, favourite television personality, childhood friends, or pet



## I wish to have...

a meaningful experience, like a gathering or staycation, an outing, a photoshoot with my loved ones, or something special (eg riding a sports car, attending a concert, going on a yacht)



## I wish to give...

back to society through a fundraiser of my own, or leave a legacy (eg recipe book, personal biography, art exhibition)

# BEHIND EVERY WISH

## Annie Cheong **HELLO FLOWERS! SINGAPORE**

Annie's journey with *Ambulance Wish Singapore* began during her time as a social work student on placement at Dover Park Hospice. It was there that she encountered, first-hand, the importance of recognising and celebrating life even in its final chapters. Observing how seemingly small gestures could carry profound significance for patients and their families left a lasting impression on her understanding of care and dignity.

This early experience would later inform her approach to giving back. Years on, through the company she owns, [Hello Flowers! Singapore](#), Annie found a way to contribute in a

manner aligned with her work. She sponsored the floral backdrop for a styled family photoshoot organised as part of a patient's wish. While modest in scale, the gesture played a meaningful role in creating a setting where a family could come together and preserve a moment of connection. The experience reaffirmed her belief in the enduring value of such contributions.

Annie maintains that making a difference does not necessarily require extraordinary measures. Rather, it can begin with offering what one already has — one's skills, resources, or expertise — with intention and care. In this way, businesses can participate in a broader culture of compassion, extending their impact beyond commercial outcomes. 🦋

# BEHIND EVERY WISH

## Mount Faber Leisure Group: A PARTNERSHIP OF LIVED WISHES

Behind every wish, there is a machinery of people and policies that come together with a willingness to accommodate lives that do not move at the usual pace.

For *Ambulance Wish Singapore*, such partnerships can shape the difference between an idea and a lived moment. Mount Faber Leisure Group (MFLG), best known for its scenic dining spots and sweeping views, also manages some of Singapore's most recognisable attractions, which have become part of our collective memory. Among them is the Singapore Cable Car, an experience many patients remember vividly, tied to earlier chapters of their lives.



We asked Tracy Lui, Deputy Director, Marketing Communications and Retail, at MFLG, how accessibility has become a key consideration across their venues.

"We believe that our attractions should be enjoyable and meaningful for everyone," she says. "This means creating a seamless, connected experience — from the Singapore Cable Car on mainland Singapore to Wings of Time Fireworks Symphony at Sentosa — supported by wheelchair-friendly cabins, step-free access and thoughtful coordination with caregivers."

Tracy also shares that MFLG's support of wish-granting experiences is guided by a simple belief that moments matter, especially when time is limited. "What may seem like a simple experience can become something far more significant for patients and their loved ones," she says. "If we can offer a sense of comfort, joy or escape, we are glad to play a small part in that journey."

So, what does it mean for her team to make these experiences possible? Tracy's reflection aligns with *Ambulance Wish Singapore's* values: "It means being part of something bigger than ourselves, where our role contributes to meaningful shared moments." 🌿
